SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

The exchange between Jesus and Pilate in today’s Gospel is, arguably, the most important exchange in all of literature. Pilate asks Jesus: “What have you done?” Jesus replies that he testifies to the truth. In the second reading we are reminded of the essence of that truth: Christ, ruler of all, loves us, liberates us from the bonds of sin, makes us into new kingdom. As we approach the Advent season, this week would be a good time to reflect on the question: What have we done in our daily lives, in our actions, words, private prayer, and in our interaction with others, to testify that Jesus is Lord?

Beginning with the new liturgical year, Year C, 2019, the season of Advent, you may notice a few slight changes during the Mass. Specifically, #117 references the altar candles, and states at least two candles must be used in any celebration, four or six, especially for a Sunday Mass or a Holyday of Obligation. There will no longer be candles on each side of the ambo; the servers will bring them to the ambo as part of the procession with Father carrying the Book of Gospels, and returned back to the altar after the Gospel reading. If the Diocesan Bishop celebrates, then seven candlesticks with lighted candles. These changes are in reference to the GIRM (General Instruction of the Roman Missal), and can be found at USCCB.org.
