FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's Gospel turns our attention to one of Jesus' most familiar stories, the Parable of the Good Samaritan. It is about living how God intended us to live: to acknowledge God's divine love and compassion lavished upon us, and to extend that love and compassion upon others without reservation. We can find a lot of reasons for not stopping to help someone. We can talk ourselves out of being Good Samaritans. Strangers are not our responsibility, or are they? Good stewards understand that God's mercy is a gift that must be shared, and that doing the right thing, acting as Jesus would act toward others, is the only course of action for one who lives according to the demands of the Gospel. How might you be a Good Samaritan this week?

Dear Friends in Christ.

Next weekend is our annual Diocesan Mission Collection. The Gospel for this Sunday, the Parable of the Good Samaritan, anticipates that appeal.

A scholar asks Jesus "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus answers with a story of a traveler beaten and robbed. A ritual priest and then a Levite ignore the man's plight. Then a despised Samaritan stops, binds the man's wounds, takes him to shelter and pays for his care. This is the neighbor, the one who shows mercy, the one who loves God by loving those in need. Neighbor is not defined by proximity, ethnicity, or nationality. For the Good Samaritan, and for us, it is defined by need. We are the Good Samaritan when we support our Mission Collection. We are binding wounds and providing care when we give to support the health ministry of Fr. Dandi Bermejo in the Philippines, to maintain parishes as compassionate communities of faith in Peru, or to feed hungry children in Mexico.

We identify as the Good Samaritan, but mission today urges us to see ourselves as the traveler in need as well. We may not have those physical needs, but priests from Africa and India are ministering to our spiritual needs. Through our mission funds, we respond by helping their churches and communities.

Mission today is a relationship, a mutual sharing of charity and mercy. Our Mission Collection makes this possible. I ask you to be generous, not because you have to, but because loving our neighbor is the way we love God. Given all the suffering from tornadoes and flooding, some might insist that charity and mercy start at home. I agree, but we can't stop there. The episodic devastation we experience is a way of life for many. Most of us have been ST. ANTHONY FINANCE COUNCIL MEETING so abundantly blessed that we can help both.
