Sunday, July 23, 2023 – Sixteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, Matthew provides several parables talking about the mystery of divine kindness. As is typical of parables, these are fictional stories with a surprising twist. The hearers of the first parable probably thought, "That master is not very smart about farming," because he told his servants to wait until harvest to separate weeds from the good grain. But the interpretation of the parable makes it clear; God does not behave as humans do. Rather, God acts with patience and restraint to the end of time giving His loving people free-will to make their own choices, knowing that His people know, there are rewards and consequences at the end of time.

Sacristan is a Great Place to Serve!

Did you know the duties of a Sacristan takes only about 15 minutes before and after Mass? A Sacristan is a parishioner who takes care of the sacristy, the church, and other church items. Sacristans set the altar before Mass by preparing the sacred vessels (glass bottles of wine and water) and placing them on the credence table and lights altar candles. At the end of Mass, he/she ensures the sacred vessels are cleaned, candles are extinguished, and all things are returned to their proper place. Sometimes a Sacristan will make preparations for Adoration, including lighting incense and candles, retrieving the monstrance, and preparing the altar and tabernacle for Eucharistic Adoration. 


