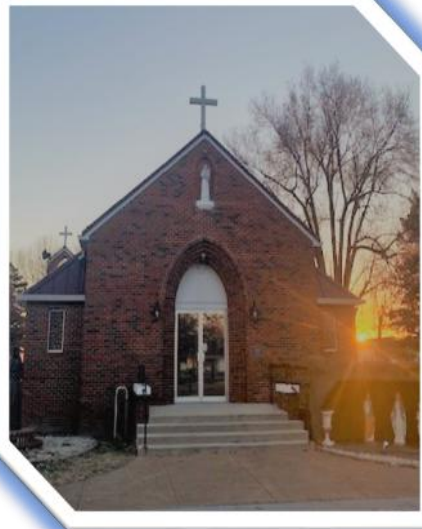

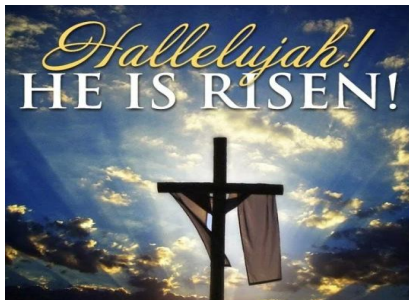

Remembering Holy Week....

April 17th - Holy Thursday. In prayer today, reflect on the astounding humility of Jesus. Imagine Him washing your feet and gently drying them with the towel around His waist. Then picture Him saying to you, "As I have done for you, you should also do." Jesus serves you in love, and He wants you to do the same for others.

April 18th - Good Friday. Jesus, You are the Lamb of God, the One who takes away the sins of the world. At any time, You could have stopped your agony. But You freely offered yourself so that I could be set free from the power of sin and death. You have redeemed me and restored me as a child of God. Thank you, Jesus...You did it for me!

April 19th - Holy Saturday. This cycle of our dying and rising with Christ doesn't begin and end with Lent and Easter. It characterizes our whole life on earth. As long as we live, we will sin and we will die. But we live in Christ! His light casts out the darkness and infuses us with grace and mercy so we also can rise with Him. Hallelujah!

April 20th, 2025 – EASTER SUNDAY

"Jesus, Risen Savior, I praise you, and I believe in you!"

They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him.

(John 20:2)

What a glorious day! It's Easter Sunday, the day of The Resurrection. Only Jesus isn't showing up! In fact, today's Gospel reading focuses on an *absent* Jesus. Mary Magdalene, Peter, and John are confronted with an empty tomb, and they don't know where He is. So rather than rejoicing, they are disappointed, bewildered and scared. These three disciplines didn't know what had happened to Jesus, but we do. In just a short time, He will greet Mary Magdalene and commission her to proclaim the Good News. Later that day, He will appear to Peter and the apostles and breathe the Holy Spirit on them. And He will appear to them again and again before ascending into Heaven. But we don't hear any of those stories today. Instead, we're waiting outside the empty tomb. So why bother rejoicing today?! Because Jesus truly is risen, whether we see Him or not. Because He truly *has* defeated death, and we truly *do* belong to Him. Because we *will* see Him one day. And until that day comes, we can experience His Spirit filling us with God's love and gradually transforming our hearts. Today truly is a glorious day; not because we have come to the end of our journey, but because we know that the Risen Christ is walking beside us. Step-by-step, He is leading us to the throne of God and to a glory that will FAR surpass our wildest dreams or imaginations!

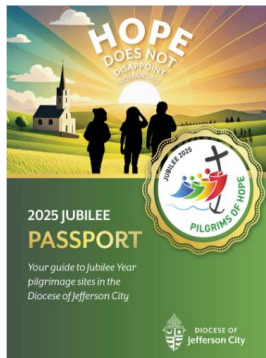

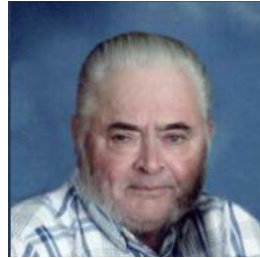

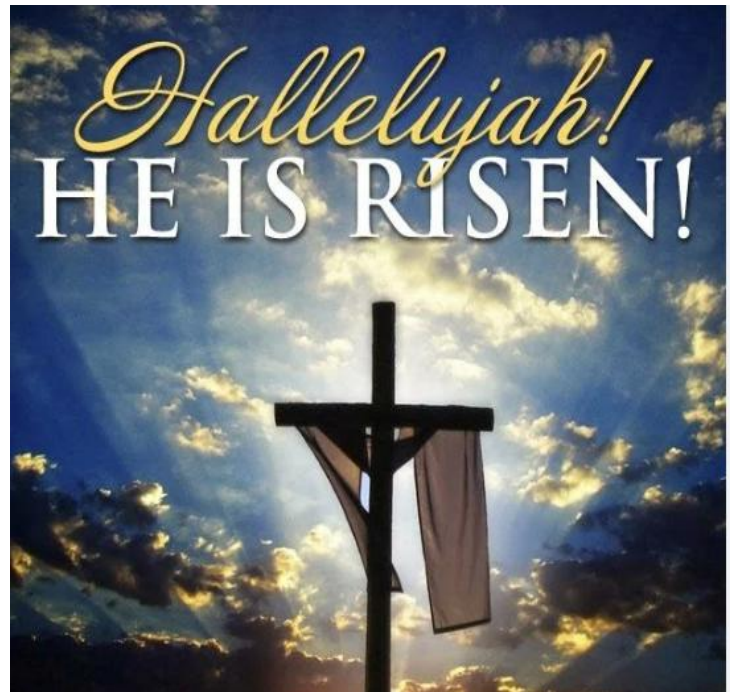
