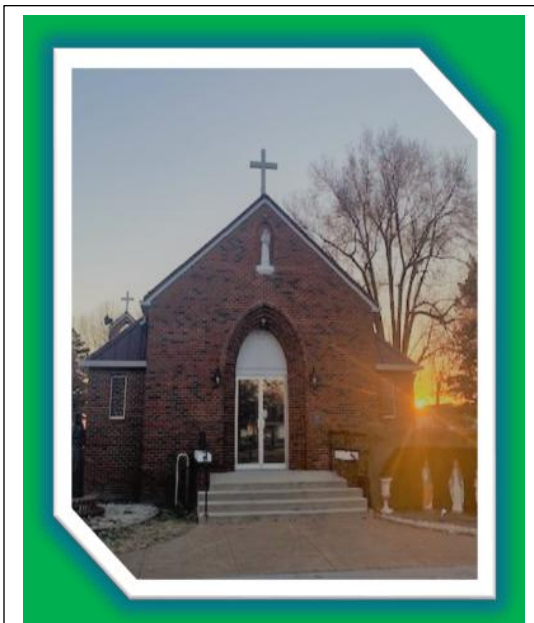

**Sunday, July 6, 2025 – Daily Reflection:** Imagine that you’re one of the disciples. You enter a small town, stand in the marketplace, and proclaim, “The kingdom of God is at hand for you”. How do you think the villagers would react? Would they be excited and want to hear more? Would they ignore you? Or would they laugh and run you out of town? In today’s Gospel, Jesus speaks to the 72 disciples he has chosen for a preaching mission. He wants to give them realistic expectations in that the people they would visit might welcome their message, but they might also reject the message and them. Jesus tells them that they are to proclaim the Good News, but the outcome of their preaching is out of their hands. And what an out it was! Even demons submitted to them. In the same way, we don’t know how people will react when we try to share our faith, as some will be open to listening to the message OR they will perhaps, not-so-politely dismiss us. Whatever the case, our decision to tell people about God’s Kingdom shouldn’t be based on how others will respond. Our responsibility, as earthly disciples, is to courageously share our faith and extend an invitation or just merely stand up for the Lord! So today, lay aside any discouragement or fear and instead, feel the power of God within your soul and heart. Grab that power and rejoice that you have done what God has called you to do and that your name, too, is written in heaven?
