



# Sunday, Sept 7, 2025 – Daily Reflection: ...that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave but ....a brother. (Philemon 15-16)

Despite being one of the shortest books in the Bible, St. Paul's Letter to Philemon (pronounced fuh-LEE-mohn) still reveals the power of the Gospel to change us. It had changed Paul so much that he viewed a runaway, criminal slave, Onesimus (pronounced Oh-NESS-ih-muss), as his own spiritual son, and it had changed this slave so much that he viewed himself as a beloved, forgiven man. Now Paul is inviting Onesimus' owner, Philemon, to let the Gospel change him. While he was in prison, Paul evangelized Onesimus, who had run away from his owner and had come seeking Paul's help. As they grew close, Paul came to view Onesimus as his spiritual "child", but he didn't stop there. In today's readings, Paul pleads with Onesimus' owner, Philemon, to take him back. Paul was clever in doing so and choose to encourage rather than demand by writing a letter saying to Philemon, "I rather urge you out of love," and he (Paul) begs Philemon to see the spiritual reality of the situation, not just the legal reality. This letter SHOWS that the Gospel is not just Good News, but that it CAN change us! Today, let the Holy Spirit show you how the power of the Gospel can change you OR help you, help someone else to change.

#### Thank, Holy Spirit, for setting us free to see ourselves and others as you do.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is an apprenticeship in living the Christian life in the Catholic Church. The rite involves four elements: Word/Scripture, Worship/Liturgy, Community, and Service. Classes will begin late September 2025 and end in April 2026.
