





Sun, Dec 21, 2025; Fourth Sunday of Advent Daily Reflection: What an interesting thing to say about Joseph: he was "righteous" yet "unwilling to expose" Mary "to shame". It seemed as if there were two different impulses in Joseph as he struggled to decide how to respond to Mary's pregnancy. Today's Gospel tells us that Jospeh was a righteous man and a devout observer of the Mosaic law. He was just in his intention to break his union with Mary; after all, she seemed to have violated their union. Still, he didn't want Mary to become an object of ridicule and shame. So he was merciful in his desire to find a quiet solution (divorce) that avoided public scandal. His solution however was not to be as the angel appeared to him (Joseph) in a dream and assured him that he didn't need to leave Mary! The angel explained the child she carried was part of God's plan to redeem the world. He was Emmanuel, God-with-us, who would fulfill both justice and mercy in himself. Joseph accepted the angel's words and he came to see that God's plans were bigger and better than his own, righteous though they were. Be this a lesson for us... God is always calling us into a deeper relationship with him. He might ask us to set aside our plans or take a step in a direction we don't understand or even want to go, but He leads us for a reason. Today and when God calls, be like Jospeh, be willing to obey God's call and trust in his goodness for you.

Lord, help me to trust in the goodness of your plan so that I can grow closer to you.

Christmas, Dec 25, 2025. The Nativity of the Lord Daily Reflection: The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. Christmas is ALMOST HERE! On this joyous day, we will join with all the angels and saints in proclaiming that Jesus, the "light" that "shines in the darkness," has come! He has come so that we could enter into his own triumph over the darkness. On the night of Jesus' birth, it seemed that darkness would prevail. Joseph and Mary were unable to secure a clean, safe place where Jesus could be born. They had to settle for a cave and a manger. Then came the harrowing flight into Egypt so that Jesus could be shielded from Herod's attempt to have him put to death. Even after his family settled in guiet Nazareth, Jesus continued to face darkness and opposition. The devil tempted him, his neighbors tired to throw him off a cliff, and people accused him of being in league with demons. But never, not even in the deepest darkness of his suffering and death, did the darkness win out. Jesus rose in victory! Jesus doesn't just promise to overcome darkness, he does it! On Christmas Day, rejoice that Jesus, the Light, has come into the world and into YOUR world. He has come to bring peace, hope, and victory. Whatever darkness you're facing this Christmas, Jesus is with you. No matter what person may try and steal your peace, hope, joy, or victory this Christmas, keep your eye fixed on Jesus! He's the one who can help you overcome anything and any one! Jesus is the reason we have a Christmas season.

Jesus, I praise you for coming and dispelling the darkness!
